Dear Parents and Carers,

On Tuesday, our Year 6 children spent the day at Winchester University. The morning was focused on life at University and they had a tour of the Campus, including the halls of residence. In the afternoon the children wore robes and mortarboards and officially graduated as Year 6s. We cannot express how proud we were of the children. On another note, I wanted to raise the issue of Health and Safety in the school as we have recently had a number of accidents in the school and in the playground. We are reviewing our practices and procedures and ensuring that reactive work takes place to address areas identified as hazards. Could we ask that you support us by speaking to your child about how they can help by making safer choices in the school. For example, this could be that they ensure that when they are playing and running in the playground that they keep an eye on where they are running and make sure they can stop if they need to. We have also had a finger trap injury in the school and sadly this resulted in the child having to attend hospital. We will now install extra finger guards for identified doors to prevent any reoccurrences of this. In the meantime, please could you remind your children about where they could catch their fingers in a door e.g. hinges and door frames.

Finally, last Saturday we held our Summer Fair over on the field behind the Cricket Club. It was a fantastic day and both children and parents have given really positive feedback on the event. The event raised £1452.52 for the school which is amazing! Thank you to all of the Parents and pupils for coming along and supporting the school. This money will go towards the cost of the lockers. A special thank you goes out to all of the Staff and Parents who helped with the day; especially Mrs Sara Deed and Mrs Anna Roe -Gilbey who were the main driving force!
