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| <p><u>Academic</u></p> <p>In Year 6, the results showed that the PP children were marginally behind the non PP children in reading, writing and maths.</p> <p>Year 4, the end of year data shows that there is no gap between PP and non PP in reading; they are marginally behind in writing and maths.</p> <p>Year 2, the end of year data shows that the PP children are out performing the non PP children in reading, writing and maths.</p> |
| <p><u>Extra 1:1 provision in year 6</u></p> <p>In maths, every child met their KS2 target.</p> <p>In writing, every child except one met their KS2 target level.</p> |
| <p><u>Attendance</u></p> <p>The attendance & % of lates of PP children is in line with non-PP children.</p> |
| <p><u>Residential</u></p> <p>100% of PP children, who wanted to, attended the residential.</p> <p>100% of PP pupils take part in curriculum based trips as part of their learning;</p> <p>Pupils show an increase in self-esteem, self-confidence and ability to co-operate within a team.</p> |
